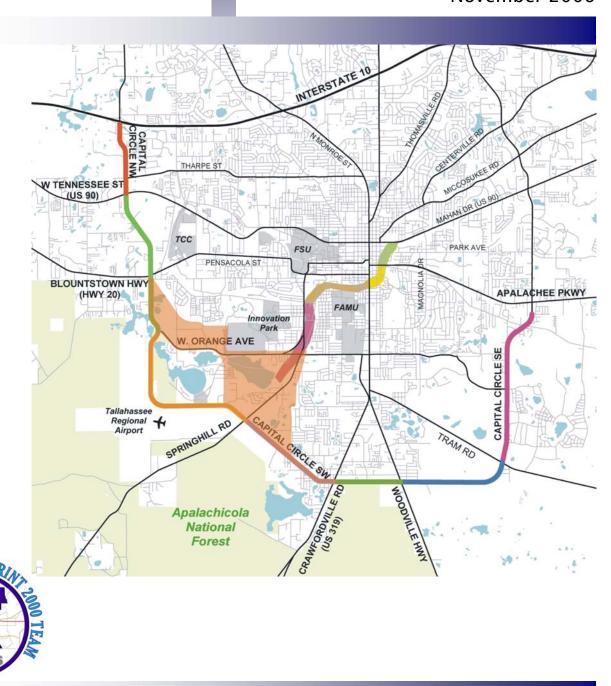

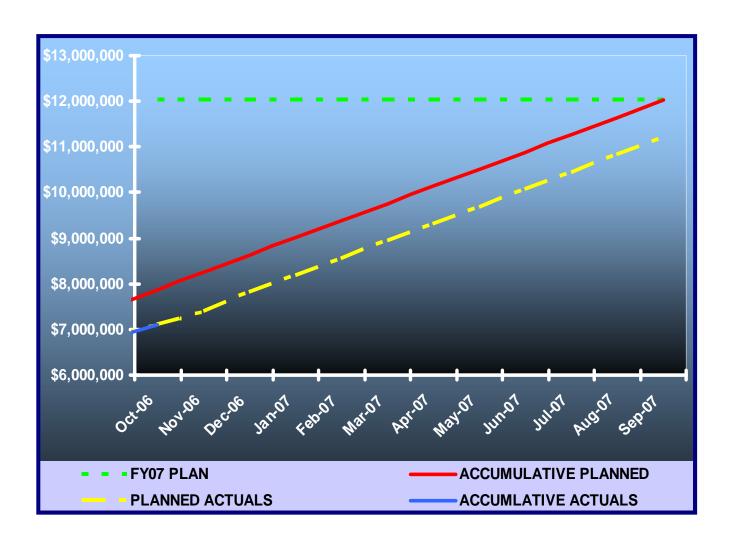

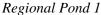

#### N1 - CAPITAL CIRCLE NW - I-10 TO US 90

#### **Project Description:**

The proposed 1.991-mile roadway project (FPID: 219722-1) consists of upgrading the existing undivided rural facility to a six-lane divided urban (curb and gutter) facility. Upgrades to the West Tennessee, Tharpe, Hartsfield and Commonwealth intersections will also be included. The purpose of the roadway improvement project is to increase the capacity and safety of the existing highway. The roadway project was designed, let and constructed by the Florida Department of Transportation, with advance funding provided by the Blueprint 2000 Intergovernmental Agency.

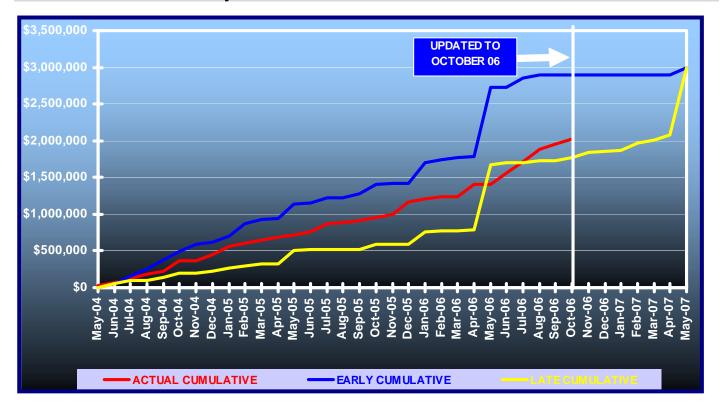

- 1. Blueprint (BP2K) continues to explore the possibility of acquiring the Delta parcel and continues to work toward a reasonable agreement, however, alternate pond locations are also under consideration. One of the locations identified is the former Broadmoor Estates Parcel. This parcel was acquired by the Tallahassee Regional Airport (TRA). TRA used City of Tallahassee and FAA Funds to acquire this parcel. If the parcel is sold or transferred from TRA ownership (even to another city agency such as BP2K) the parcel must be appraised and conveyed at fair market value. Funds received from the conveyance would reimburse the FAA. This is an excellent pond location and BP2K has requested an appraisal on the former Broadmoor Estates Parcel and is awaiting the completion of this appraisal before continuing negotiations.
- 2. BP2K received approval from the IA at the September 16, 2006 meeting to acquire 61 parcels. Negotiations are ongoing for appraisal, acquisition, and relocation services.



#### **Project Description:**

A Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study will be conducted for a portion of Capital Circle (SR 263) between Crawfordville Road (SR 61 US 319) and Blountstown Highway (SR 20) a distance of approximately 6.7 miles. The PD&E study will be conducted in accordance with Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Blueprint 2000 Agency, and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) guidelines. The study will evaluate alternative alignments as well as the existing alignment. Several viable alternatives will be developed and evaluated in order to address the project needs while taking into account the Blueprint 2000 & Beyond "Project Definitions Report", prepared by the Economic and Environmental Consensus Committee in 1999, and the Lake Bradford Sector Plan, conducted by the Tallahassee/Leon County Planning Department.

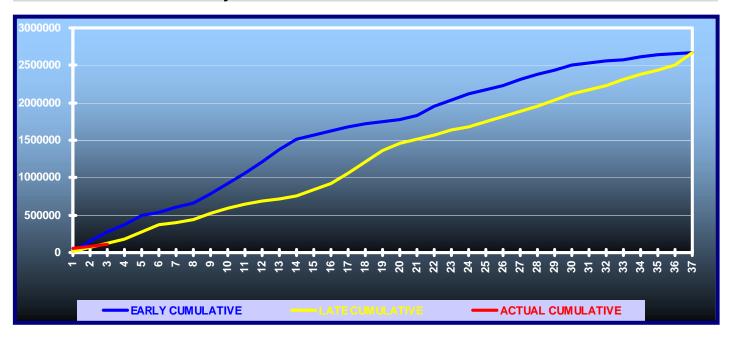

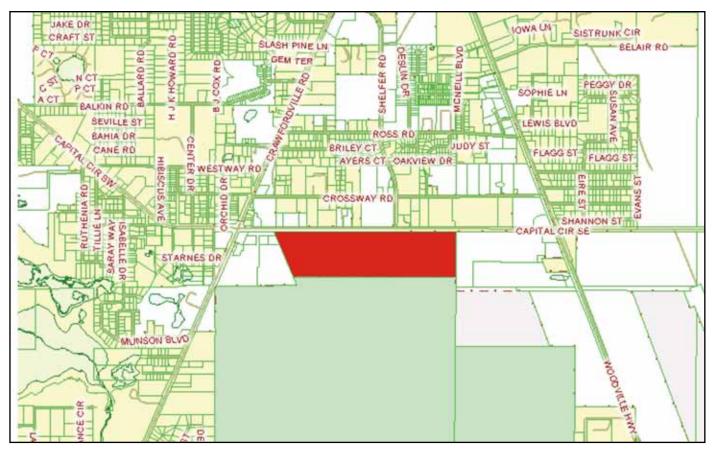

#### **Right-Of-Way Status Report:**



The Flea Market Tract is owned by the United States Forest Service (USFS). It appears that the acquisition by Leon County is the most logical and appropriate solution. To accomplish this USFS will need to present legislation to the federal government that would allow USFS to sell this site. If this legislation is approved, USFS has agreed to sell this parcel to Leon County less the land necessary for Right-of-Way and drainage improvements. The purchase price for Leon County will be determined by appraised value. This value will be based upon the remaining acreage; further USFS has agreed to provide Blueprint with a Right-of-Way and drainage easements (at no cost to Blueprint) for the E-3 project and Blueprint is concurrently proceeding with submitting an application to USFS. 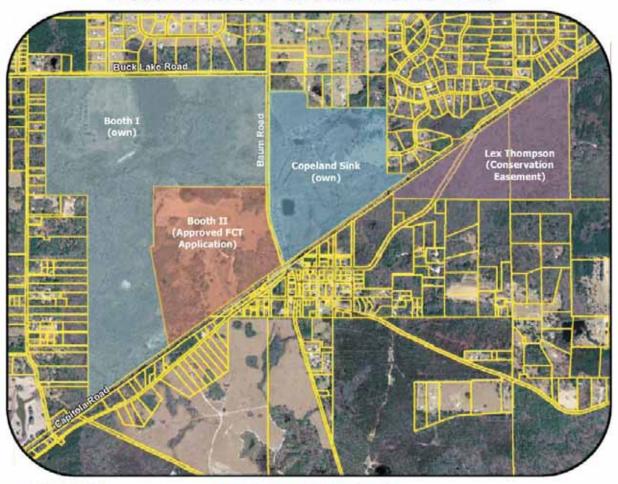
