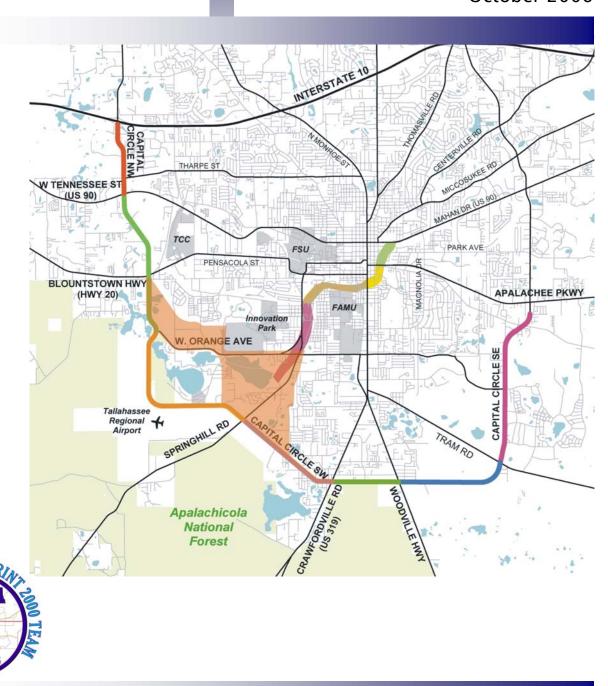

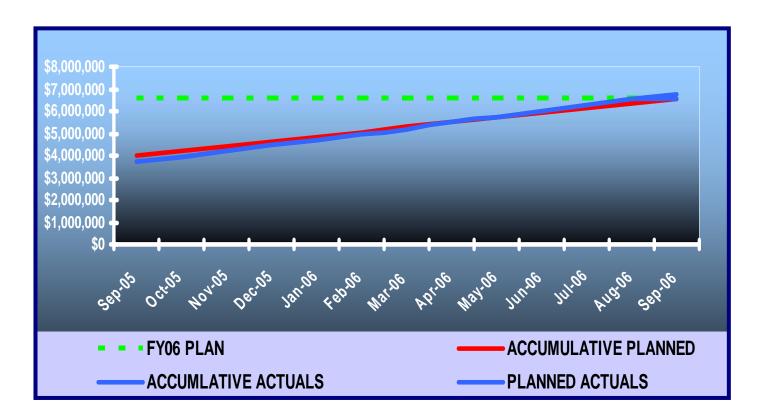

The proposed 1.991-mile roadway project (FPID: 219722-1) consists of upgrading the existing undivided rural facility to a six-lane divided urban (curb and gutter) facility. Upgrades to the West Tennessee, Tharpe, Hartsfield and Commonwealth intersections will also be included. The purpose of the roadway improvement project is to increase the capacity and safety of the existing highway. The roadway project was designed, let and constructed by the Florida Department of Transportation, with advance funding provided by the Blueprint 2000 Intergovernmental Agency.

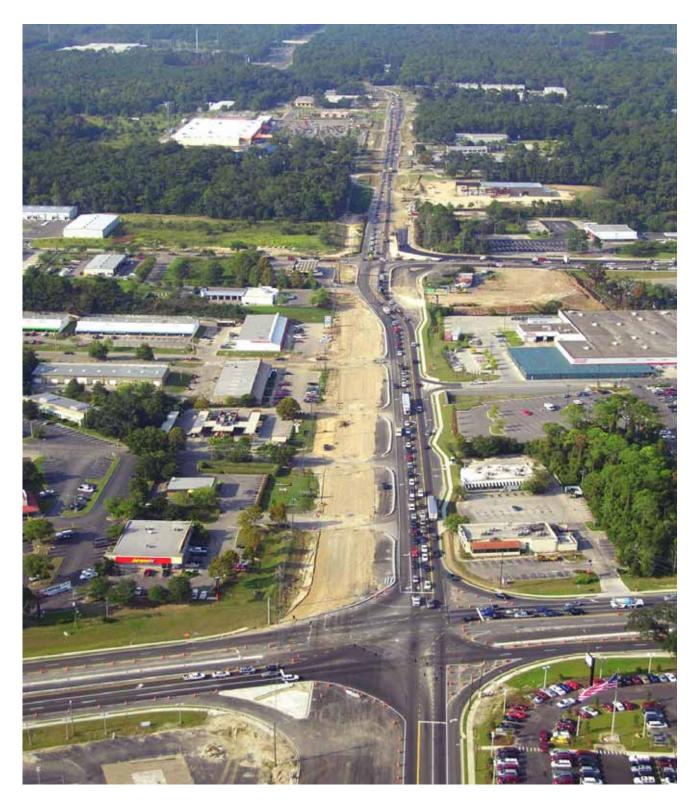

FDOT initially made the determination that this project must meet the FHIS Design Speed of 50 MPH. The project is currently designed for a 45 MPH urban facility. Blueprint will be seeking a variance on the FHIS typical section requirements.

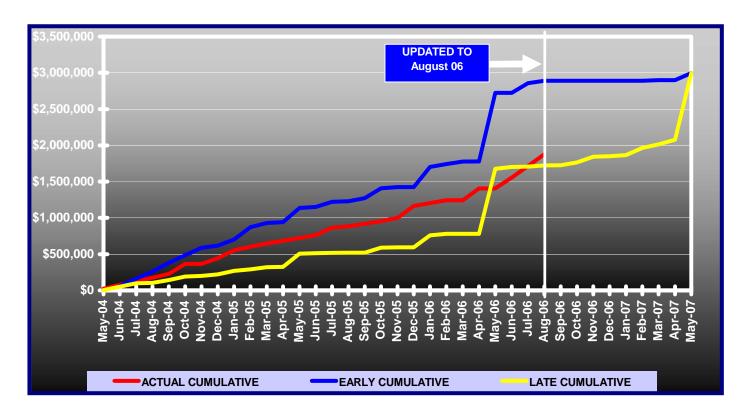

- 1. Blueprint continues to explore the possibility of acquiring the Delta Parcel, however, alternate pond locations are under consideration. One of the locations identified is the former Broadmoor Estates Parcel/Airport Parcel. Blueprint has requested an appraisal on the former Broadmoor Estates Parcel and are awaiting the completion of this appraisal before continuing negotiations.
- 2. Blueprint received approval from the IA at the September 16, 2006 meeting to acquire 61 parcels. Negotiations are ongoing for appraisal, acquisition, and relocation services.



Project Description:

A Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study will be conducted for a portion of Capital Circle (SR 263) between Crawfordville Road (SR 61 US 319) and Blountstown Highway (SR 20) a distance of approximately 6.7 miles. The PD&E study will be conducted in accordance with Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Blueprint 2000 Agency, and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) guidelines. The study will evaluate alternative alignments as well as the existing alignment. Several viable alternatives will be developed and evaluated in order to address the project needs while taking into account the Blueprint 2000 & Beyond "Project Definitions Report", prepared by the Economic and Environmental Consensus Committee in 1999, and the Lake Bradford Sector Plan, conducted by the Tallahassee/Leon County Planning Department.

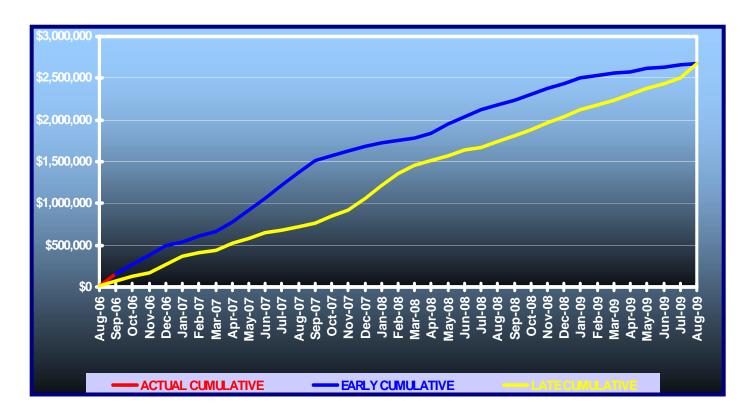

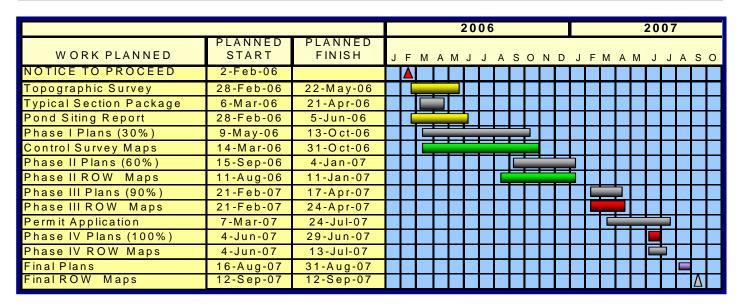
Flea Market Tract - Linear Pond Design

RESOLUTION

URS has completed the design and analysis for the ponds located in Basins 2 and 3 within the Flea Market Tract. The ponds have been surveyed and a legal description has been provided to USFS and Leon County.

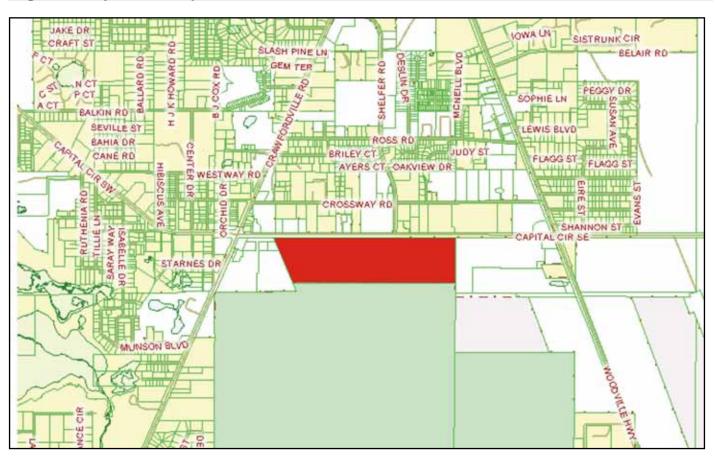

Right-Of-Way Status Report:



The Flea Market Tract is owned by the United States Forest Service (USFS). It appears that the acquisition by Leon County is the most logical and appropriate solution. To accomplish this USFS will need to present legislation to the federal government that would allow USFS to sell this site. If this legislation is approved, USFS has agreed to sell this parcel to Leon County less the land necessary for right-of-way and drainage improvements. The purchase price for Leon County will be determined by appraised value. This value will be based upon the remaining acreage; further USFS has agreed to provide Blueprint with a right-of-way and drainage easements (at no cost to Blueprint) for the E-3 project and Blueprint is concurrently proceeding with submitting an application to USFS. Note: This easement application is not subject to the federal legislation being approved; and should the land be acquired by Leon County the easement application process with USFS will be unnecessary.

As of the end of September 2006 we are still waiting on the federal legislation being approved.

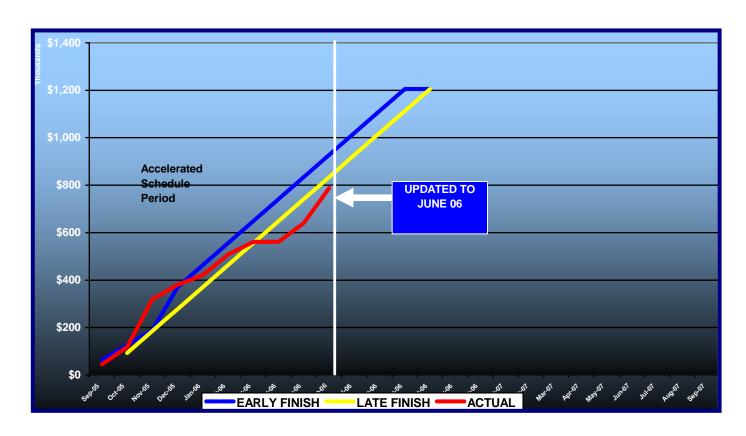

Project Status:

Erosion Control and Clearing and Grubbing work is complete from Tram Road to north of Monday Street. COT Utility relocation permit has been obtained for all segments. The EMP conditional permit for Segment 2 was granted on October 31, 2005. Segment 2B EMP permit conditions have been satisfied and full permit for Segment 2 is in effect as of April 20, 2006. Design of Segment 3 is complete and the 100% complete plans have been submitted to Blueprint for review and comments. The permit for Segment 4 was obtained on June 8, 2006 and final plans for that segment have been released for construction. The conditional EMP permit for Segment 3 was issued on September 8, 2006. Earthworks on Segment 3 are in progress. Utilities have been relocated on Segments 1 and 2 and relocation on Segments 3 and 4 is in progress. Work on re-use water line installation is in progress. Placement of COT Water Utility potable waterline and storm drainage system is complete between Tram Road and Blairstone Road. Curb and gutter and structural asphalt have been placed on CCSE between Tram Road and Merchants Row Boulevard. Concrete curb and gutter, basecourse and structural asphalt were completed on northbound lanes between Merchants Row Boulevard and Blairstone Road at the beginning of July 2006. A section of Tram Road east of CCSE is paved and opened to traffic on August 7, 2006. Structural asphalt was placed on south side of Tram Road (eastbound lanes) west of CCSE. Clearing and grubbing on Segment 4 is in progress. Work on Pond 11 on Segment 4 is in progress. Grading on Segment 4 has been started. No major erosion control, safety, or maintenance of traffic issues to date.

The temporary traffic signals were installed at Merchants Row intersection, some temporary striping put down, and traffic was switched over to the final CCSE southbound lanes between Tram Road and Merchants Row Boulevard on February 6th. The DRB meeting was held on October 3, 2006.

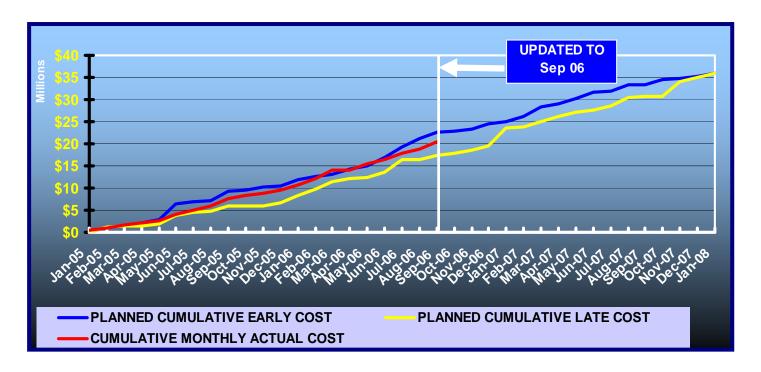

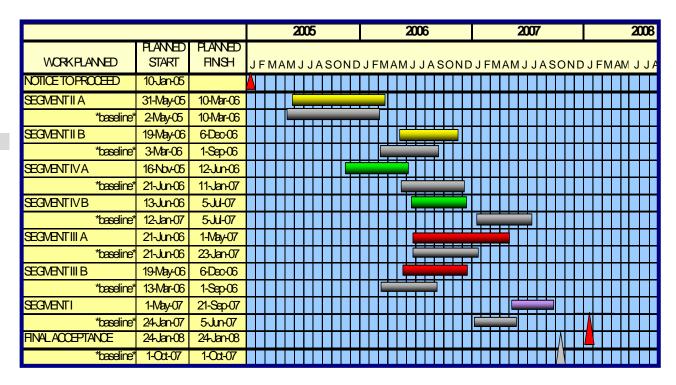
